The Social Studies Curriculum Pacing Guide for Junior High Schools in The Bahamas is a structured plan aimed at guiding students' progression and expected educational achievements. This pacing guide fosters the development of critical thinking skills and an understanding of diverse interconnected subjects including History, Geography, Civics, Economics, and Cultural Studies. Students will explore various aspects of human societies, their interactions, and their impact on the world.

Covering grades 7 to 9, this curriculum prepares students for a comprehensive understanding of social dynamics and equips them with the knowledge and skills needed to become informed and responsible citizens. It encourages active engagement, critical analysis, and empathy towards global and local issues.
